Community Media Center Open House to Feature Studio Workshop and Screening of Local Documentary

CMC to Present Free Public Screening of “Inseparable: The Matt and Caitlin Boles Story”

Westminster, Maryland (January 3, 2012) – The Community Media Center (CMC) is holding an Open House on Saturday, January 7, 2012 from 9:00 am - 2:00 pm. The day will feature an overview of CMC programs, a studio production workshop and the free public screening of a locally produced documentary.

To kick off the event, the Media Center will offer a public screening of the local documentary, “Inseparable: The Matt and Caitlin Boles Story”, produced by Nathan Stewart of Finksburg. The video honors the life of Matthew and Caitlin Boles, Westminster High School students tragically killed in a car crash in 2008. The screening is scheduled for 10:00 am and the event is free to the public, but donations will be accepted for the Matthew and Caitlin Boles Foundation. The Boles family will hold a question and answer session immediately following the film.

The Community Media Center holds regular workshops for volunteers and producers to learn video production and editing skills, and encourages individuals in our local community to create their own content for public access. Nathan’s documentary is a perfect example of how local video production can impact our community. This story has touched many hearts and we are pleased to share his work and help celebrate the lives of these two young people by offering a free screening.

At 12:30 pm, the Media Center will present a studio production workshop. Attendees will learn about overall studio operations including: sound, switching, camera operation and lighting elements needed for a studio production. In addition, visitors will learn about some of the CMC’s special initiatives including: The Carroll County History Project, The Washington Road Community Trail, television training programs, memberships, internships and volunteer opportunities.

To better accommodate public interest, the CMC now offers extended hours every Wednesday evening until 8:00pm and the center will be open every other Saturday from 9:00 am - 2:00 pm, beginning January 7, 2012.
