



Day 1 Miami Arrive in Miami and transfer to your airport hotel on your own. This evening in the hotel lobby meet your Central Holidays Representative who will hold a mandatory Cuba orientation meeting where you will receive your final Cuba documentation and meet your traveling companions.

Day 2 Miami/Havana This morning, transfer to Miami International Airport - then board your flight for the one-hour trip to Havana. Upon arrival at José Martí International Airport you will be met by your English-speaking Cuban escort and drive through the city where time stands still, stopping at Revolution Square to see the famous Che Guevara image with his well-known slogan of "Hasta la Victoria Siempre" (Until the Everlasting Victory, Always) lives. Following lunch, you head to your hotel, the Melia Cohiba, for check-in and an informational briefing to review your program for the coming week. Classic cars from the 1950s will escort you to a welcome dinner at a "paladar," a privately-owned small restaurant serving homemade Cuban dishes, followed by a variety of optional local and authentic cultural activities. (L,D)

Day 3 Havana After breakfast you will tour the Museum of the Revolution that displays a vast array of documents, weapons, relics and even planes from the revolution. The museum is housed in the former presidential palace that was the home to Cuba's leaders from the 1920s until 1959. Continuing onwards you will have an educational exchange with a local expert who will speak about Havana's unique architecture, the challenges of renovating the city's exquisite historic buildings, and the future of these restorations. You will also visit the Casa de Africa (Africa House) and enjoy a live cultural performance before heading to lunch with Cuban guests at the Community Project and paladar. Then, you will explore the charming cobblestone streets of Old Havana, a UNESCO World Heritage Site, while participating in an open dialogue with the local expert on architectural topics of interest. Before dinner, meet a former Cuban baseball player and join in a dialogue regarding the history and the love of this favorite pastime in Cuba. This evening, enjoy your dinner at a local restaurant. (B,L,D)

Day 4 Havana/Vinales/Pinar Del Rio/Havana Today you will venture northwest out of Havana through the Cuban countryside to the UNESCO World Heritage site of the Viñales Valley, located in Cuba's western most mountainous range. This region, situated in the province of Pinar Del Río, is known for its breathtaking scenery. The area is dotted with spectacular limestone mountains (mogotes) rising to a height of up to 300 meters. Here you will gaze upon spectacular caverns and rivers and discover the region's vast tobacco fields, still cultivated today using traditional methods that have survived unchanged for centuries. In Pinar Del Río you will tour the Franciso Donatien Cigar Factory to learn about the manufacturing of fine Cuban cigars and enjoy an educational exchange with workers about the history and process of cigar-making in Cuba. As your day continues, you will visit a traditional tobacco plantation and farmhouse where you will get to know an authentic tobacco farmer. During this enlightening interaction you will learn about tobacco cultivation and the tobacco leaf drying process then experience a cigar rolling demonstration firsthand. Enjoy a visit inside the farmer's home and have a sit-down with his family while sipping on a "cafecito" – a sweetened shot of Cuban-style espresso coffee. This is a superb opportunity to witness up-close how Cuban families live in a rural setting. After this exciting encounter, a stop at Los Jasmines viewpoint offers the ideal photo-op with its awe-inspiring views of Viñales Valley, perfect for panoramic pictures of this splendidly beautiful region. (B,L)

Day 5 Havana/Santiago De Cuba Today you depart Havana for Santiago de Cuba, but before you leave, you will meet with the Habana Compas Dance Company for a special interaction with and performance by the dancers as well as time with the director. Next it's off to the airport for a quick flight to Santiago de Cuba, the "Heroic City," where you will be greeted with lunch at a local restaurant before checking into your hotel, the Melia Santiago. A special bus/walking tour is arranged for the group with a local historian and preservationist, Omar Lopez, with whom you will explore the second largest city in Cuba. Santiago de Cuba was founded in 1515 and was the starting point of expeditions to explore the island. As the birthplace to some of Cuba's most famous musicians, the city is also known for its traditional dances and its Carnival celebration in July. A special welcome dinner with local favorites is enjoyed tonight followed by a few special cultural options. (B,L,D)

Day 6 Santiago De Cuba Today is a full day of fun in Santiago de Cuba. Following breakfast, you will visit the Society of Tumba Francesa de la Caridad del Oriente and its president. A special performance awaits at this UNESCO World Heritage Site. Lunch is at a local restaurant, followed by a VIP guided tour and performance at the Carnival Museum, which is a showcase in time (the songs and dances brought to Cuba by the African slaves have survived the passage of time and have developed in every corner of the island). The Museum is home to special items from the biggest Carnival party between Rio and New Orleans every July – from floats to effigies. Afterwards, you will visit Casa del Caribe (Caribbean House), a famous local home/museum that is filled with city history and cultural items. Dinner this evening will be enjoyed at a local paladar, then you will have the chance to speak one–on–one with local residents of the community to learn how they live, their history and more. (B,L,D)

Day 7 Santiago De Cuba This morning you will visit El Cobre, the sanctuary of the Patron Saint of Cuba, and climb a short distance to see the monument of the Runaway Slave. This sculpture is built of iron and bronze on a hill, and honors one of the earliest and most important slave revolts in the country in 1731. A special guest, a professor at the University of Oriente, will join the group for lunch at a local restaurant to share even more in–depth knowledge of the city and country. In the afternoon you will take a guided tour of the Moncada Barracks, where the first armed action of the Cuban Revolution occurred on July 26, 1953. This evening you are free to enjoy dinner and activities at your leisure – Cuba is yours to explore! (B,L)

Day 8 Santiago De Cuba/Camaguey This morning you depart Santiago de Cuba and head to Camagüey, Cuba's largest province located in the center of the island. Camagüey's winding maze of streets was built that way to confuse marauding pirates, and it is filled with cobblestone plazas, historic statues and lavish churches. On the way, you'll stop in Bayamo, founded in 1513 and one of the largest cities in the Oriente region. You'll have a chance to walk around the historic town and enjoy some local sounds from musicians while enjoying a light lunch at a local restaurant. We continue on to





Camagüey and check into the Gran Hotel. This evening dinner is at a local Paladar. Further optional cultural activities are on offer this evening to get you in the true Camagüey spirit! (B,L,D)

Day 9 Camaguey As this is your final full day in Cuba, we are going to make the most of it with a busy day of activities! First is a walking tour of Camagüey's city center with a representative from the Office of the City Historian. You will have time to explore the many UNESCO-declared sites here, as well as enjoy a special rehearsal by the dancers of the Folkloric Ballet of Camagüey. Lunch is on your own in the city center before heading to the Casanova Pottery Studio to see up-close how they create their trademark "tinajones," earthenware pots made of clay and other materials that line the streets of Camagüey which were once used to collect rainwater. This evening, you are treated to a farewell dinner followed by live Afro-Cuba jazz at a local nightclub! (B,L,D)

Day 10 Camaguey to USA Enjoy a final Cuban breakfast at your hotel this morning before heading to the airport for your return flight home filled with memories of your amazing Cuban adventure. (B)

TOUR PRICE
